## **Abortion in Alabama Factsheet**

Abortion is a common healthcare intervention.1

Many factors affect access to abortion such as legality in the state where you live, affordability, time, and getting the care you need with dignity and respect.

Abortion access is a critical public health, human rights, and reproductive justice issue.

Abortion was first made illegal in Alabama in 1841 and was not addressed again in the Alabama Legislature until 1951 to take it from a felony to misdemeanor to perform abortion.<sup>2</sup>

The 1973 Roe v Wade decision by the US Supreme Court made abortion legal to perform again in Alabama and by 1982 there were 45 locations in Alabama where a person could receive abortion care.<sup>2</sup>

Starting in 1987 the Alabama Legislature began passing laws to ban abortion in certain circumstances, starting with **parental consent** and reaching to **gestational bans**, **mandatory waiting periods**, **insurance coverage bans**, **and coercive mandatory counseling**.

In 2018, **Constitutional Amendment 2** was passed by ballot initiative which baked fetal personhood into the **Alabama Constitution.**<sup>3</sup> This means that the state "acknowledges, declares, and affirms that it is the **public policy of [Alabama]** to **ensure the protection of the rights of the unborn child [fetus]** in all manners and measures **lawful** and appropriate."<sup>4</sup>

In 2019, there were only **3 operating abortion clinics in the state**, spread to the north in Huntsville, to the west in Tuscaloosa, and south central in Montgomery.

During the 2019 Alabama Legislative Session, the **Alabama Human Life Protection Act** was passed which criminalized all abortions in the state except for when the life of the pregnant person is at risk. Because of the federal protection of Roe v Wade the near total ban did not go into effect, until Roe v Wade was overturned in June 2022.

Now, with a common and essential healthcare intervention completely out of reach for Alabamians we are seeing the consequences of almost two centuries of anti-abortion rhetoric and laws continue to wreak havoc on Alabama families.
