



The Equal Access to Abortion Coverage in Health Insurance (EACH) Act

What is EACH?

- ★ The Equal Access to Abortion Coverage in Health Insurance Act, or EACH, is bold federal legislation that works to reverse abortion coverage restrictions.

What does EACH do?

- ★ Restores abortion coverage to those in a government health insurance plan (e.g., Medicaid).
- ★ Prevents lawmakers from interfering with Insurance Markets to prevent them from providing abortion coverage.
- ★ Works to undo the harmful Hyde Amendment, which bars the use of federal funds for abortions with exceptions only for rape, incest, or life endangerment.

Why is EACH important for young people?

- ★ For decades, the Hyde Amendment has restricted abortion access for millions of people in the United States, especially Black, Indigenous, and other people of color, LGBTQ+ people, and those with low incomes. EACH would ensure that millions across the country will have access to abortion care through their healthcare coverage.
- ★ Young people, including those who receive their healthcare coverage through plans like Medicaid, deserve to make decisions that preserve their right to live fully autonomous lives, including abortion access.
- ★ Where we live or how much money we make should not determine our ability to access abortion. Passing the EACH Act is a step toward a world in which Reproductive Justice can be achieved.

What can you do?

- ★ Contact your legislators and ask them to cosponsor EACH! If your legislator is already a cosponsor, ask them to get their colleagues on as a cosponsor as well!
